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Sivan Keren was born in Israel. She began her music studies playing the flute, graduating in 2009. She began her vocal studies in 2012 with Professor Tamar Rachum, and completed her Bachelor and Master degree in Prof. Rachum's class in the Buchman-Mehta School of Music at the Tel Aviv University (2013-2019).

She was also a semifinalist in Riccardo Zandonai Concorso lirico in Italy (2018), and a semi-finalist in Hilde Zadek Voice Competition in Vienna, Austria (2019) and a semi-finalist in Vox Artis competition in Romania (2019), and was selected to participate in Festival der jungen Stimmen with concerts in Sigriswill, Bern, Basel, Zürich and Wiesbaden (2019).
